The Mary Rose

On 20 July 2016, the Mary Rose embarks on its next exciting chapter. Visitors will be able to see the hull of Henry VIII's favourite ship like never seen before.

Visitors will see stunning panoramic views of the ship from all 9 galleries through floor to ceiling glazing on the lower & main deck. On the upper deck, visitors will breathe the same air as Henry VIII's warship for the first time in 23 years, with only a balcony between them and the hull.





The full story revealed



The only 16th Century warship on display in the world, the Mary Rose has been undergoing continuous conservation since she was raised in 1982. The hull was first sprayed with a mist of chilled water and then with a water soluble wax from 1994. In April 2013, the Mary Rose entered a state of controlled air-drying and a brand new museum that wowed the world was opened later that year.

The hull has now reached a stable state with this drying process, making the ship hall the largest environmentally controlled display in the world.

This visit will include privileged arrangements with refreshments, a specialist talk on "Lost & Found: The Archaeology of the Mary Rose" and an independent Museum visit.
